

Dear parents,



Last year, the rules regarding the use of fireworks were changed. Those rules of course still apply: Fireworks may only be set off on December 31st and January 1st. It is important that children, young people and adults know the rules – and help each other stay safe, so everyone can enjoy a secure and pleasant New Year's Eve. Please talk to your children about the rules and about how they can help protect themselves, their friends, and the surroundings when enjoying fireworks. And of course, remember the five essential fireworks safety tips to reduce the risk of injuries.

Useful facts to know and pass on:

- Fireworks may only be used legally on December 31st and January 1st
- You can legally purchase fireworks in stores from December 15th to December 31st
- Fireworks must be legal and CE-marked
- Violating the fireworks regulations can result in fines

Contact the police

Contact the police and call 1-1-4 if you find an abandoned/discarded chrysanthemum bomb or a powerful firework such as a "canonslag" – never touch it yourself!

De fem fyrværkeriråd

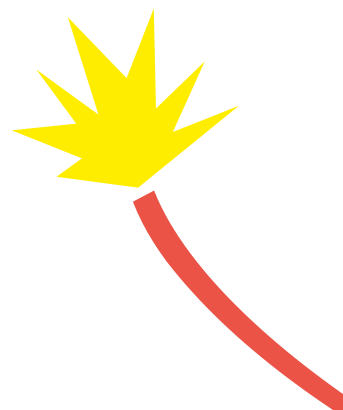
1. Always wear protective eyewear
2. Only use approved fireworks – never homemade or illegal fireworks
3. Never hold lit fireworks in your hand
4. Keep a safe distance and never lean over fireworks
5. Never go back to a misfire
