Dear parent

We need to help one another – there needs to be a joint effort

In recent times there has been a series of clashes between groups of criminals. Only a very small number of youths are involved in this conflict, which is primarily a conflict between groups of adults. It is crucial to continue to keep youths out of the conflict. In order to do this we need your help. As a parent you have an opportunity to talk to your child about how serious this conflict is. Below you can read some good advice on how, together, we can prevent children and youths from becoming involved in the conflict.

Good advice

Talk to your child/youth about how serious the current conflict is.

Take an interest in what your child/youth gets up to in the evening – and who they are with.

You are responsible for ensuring that your child/youth is not a public nuisance.

If you as a parent are concerned about other children or youths, you should communicate your concerns to the social services.
